DECREASE in appropriations: \$75.195 million (28.8 percent) over 12-year period

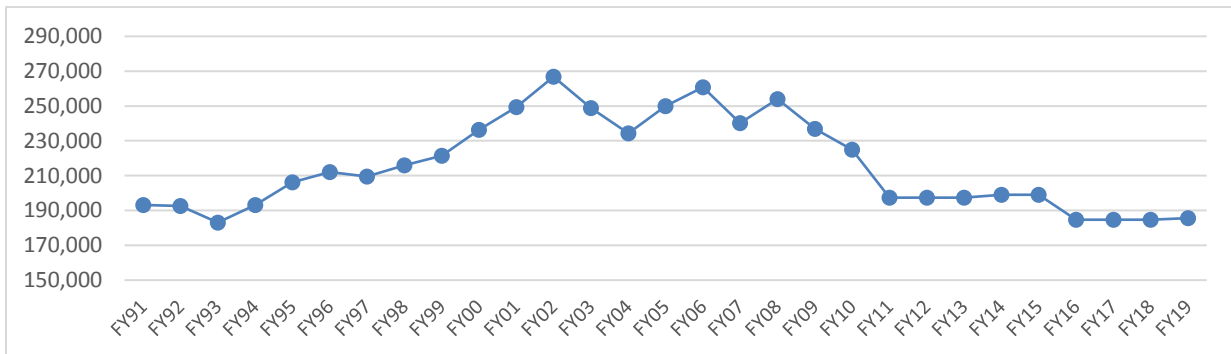

- **FLAT FUNDING** in FY 2019; *Rowan's increase in funding reflects the fact that Rowan University founded Cooper Medical School of Rowan University which welcomed its first class in the summer of 2012 and graduated its charter class in May 2016. Rowan, therefore, is not included in these totals.

(actual dollars, no adjustment for inflation)

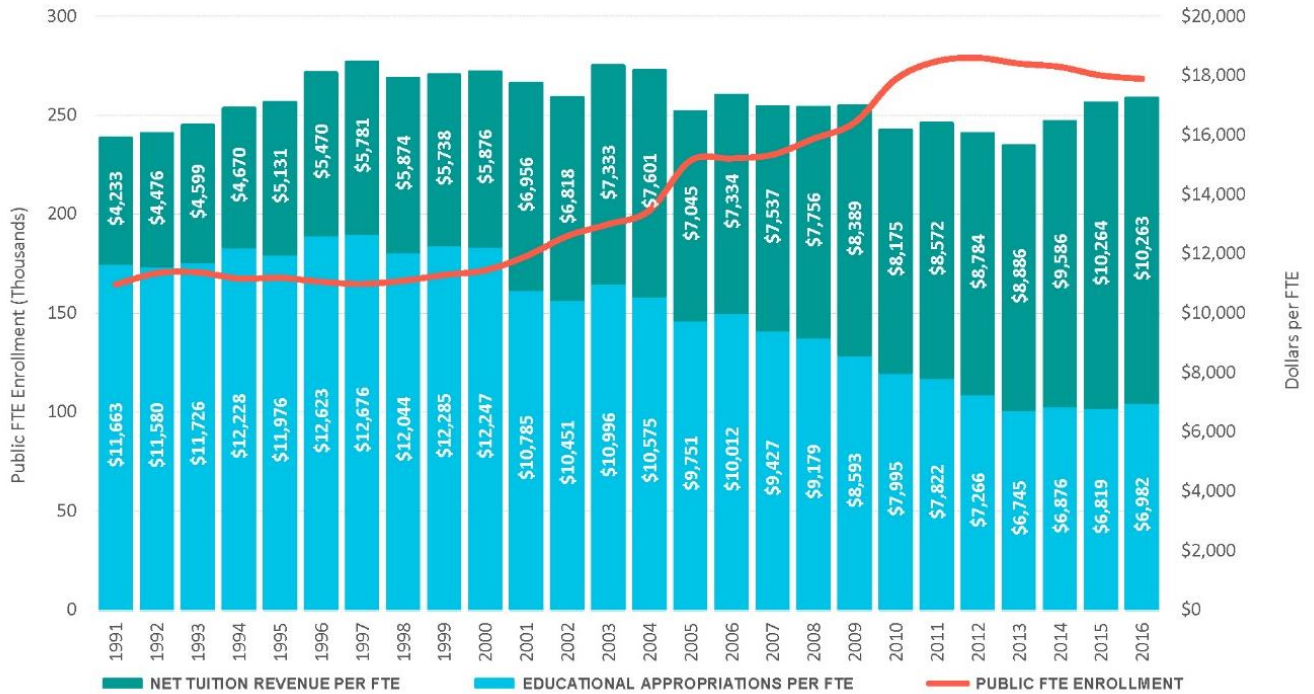
DECREASE in appropriations: \$8.414 million (4.35 percent) over 28-year period.

DECREASE in appropriations per full-time equivalent student by \$4,681 (40.1 percent), while enrollment INCREASED by 103,930 students (63.2 percent)



NOTES: Data adjusted for inflation using the Higher Education Cost Adjustment (HECA). Full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment equates student credit hours to full-time, academic year students, but excludes medical students. Educational appropriations are a measure of state and local support available for public higher education operating expenses including ARRA funds, and exclude appropriations for independent institutions, financial aid for students attending independent institutions, research, hospitals, and medical education. Net tuition revenue is calculated by taking the gross amount of tuition and fees, less state and institutional financial aid, tuition waivers or discounts, and medical student tuition and fees. Net tuition revenue used for capital debt service is included in the net tuition revenue figures above.

- Over 25 years (FY1991- FY2016), appropriations per FTE decreased from \$11,663 to \$6,982 at New Jersey’s public colleges and universities.
- Over 25 years (FY 1991-FY 2016), public FTE enrollment at New Jersey’s public colleges and universities increased from 164,366 to 268,296 students.

* *State college and university refers to those four-year institutions designated as “state” higher education institutions by NJ State Statute (The College of New Jersey, Kean University, New Jersey City University, Ramapo College of New Jersey, Stockton University, Thomas Edison State University, and William Paterson University).*

** *Public college and university refers to the state colleges and universities, the public research universities (Rutgers University, Rowan University, Montclair State University, and New Jersey Institute of Technology), and the 19 community colleges. Note: Montclair was designated a research institution on July 21, 2017, but the FY '18 budget appropriations were finalized when Montclair was still designated as a state institution.*
